

Dated: March 2023 To be reviewed: March 2026 Staff involved: Strategic Team Warwick Academy supports the viewing, reading, and listening of appropriate instructional media (video, text, and music) across the Primary & Secondary Schools (all ages).

When using any instructional media such as, internet video streaming, DVDs, written text, and music (in particular the lyrics), the following must be considered:

- 1. The capacity of the instructional media to support the curriculum.
- 2. The capacity to reach the personal interest level, maturity, and ability of students.
- 3. The importance of the subject matter in the context of the cultural diversity of the school.
- 4. The age appropriateness. Use guidelines from resources like the Motion Picture Association of America or the British Board of Film Classification guidelines; and reviews from other recognised sources like: commonsensemedia.org.
- 5. Use of all instructional media must comply with copyright laws and regulations.

Staff must follow this process when making a decision about what instructional media to share with students in class:

- 1. Have you watched/listened/read it fully?
- 2. Does it meet the instructional needs of the students?
- 3. Have you used an appropriate source to help categorise/review the appropriateness of the instructional media you are using? For example, use Common Sense Media for movies (referenced above).
- 4. Is there an age restriction?
 - A. If YES:
 - a. The age restriction must be appropriate for that age group.
 - b. For a rating above the age of the students:
 - i. The Deputy Head: Curriculum must be consulted in advance of a rating above the age of the students.
 - A signed parental permission form including descriptive information about the instructional media (movie/DVD/internet clip/song/text) as well as the instructional purpose is required in advance for all students. In some cases, a letter can be provided at the start of the academic year to cover all the media that a course or subject will use throughout the year. This avoids having to send out individual letters over the course of the year.
 - **c.** The section/portion of the media to be viewed/listened to/read is such that it is appropriate for the age group using the material, it can then be used.
 - B. If NO:
 - a. Some types of media may not be age rated and (b) will be your default position.
 - b. Using your professional opinion is the instructional media age appropriate. If you are unsure of appropriateness, consult with your line manager and/or Deputy Head: Curriculum for approval before using the media.
