

Winner of Japan's top literary prize used ChatGPT:

"Rie Kudan, 33, was recently awarded the prestigious Akutagawa Prize for her sci-fi novel Tokyo-to Dojo-to (Tokyo Sympathy Tower), which focuses on a high-rise prison tower. The book includes themes about Al. Judges reportedly called her novel "almost flawless." However, during her acceptance speech, Kudan revealed a portion of the book had been written by ChatGPT"

Referencing Academic Work:

As part of our ongoing commitment to academic excellence, we are emphasizing the importance of referencing academic work properly. Teaching our students the art of proper citation is not just about meeting academic requirements, it is a crucial skill that prepares them for the rigors of higher education and beyond. When students learn to cite their sources accurately, they not only demonstrate academic integrity, but they also acknowledge the ideas and research of others. By instilling this practice early on, we empower our students to engage with information ethically and navigate the vast sea of knowledge with confidence. For consistency purposes, the MLA citation style is adopted throughout KS3 and KS4 levels. Although other citation methodologies are accepted at the International Baccalaureate level, MLA remains the best option to cite Al-generated content. The school library offers on-going support with citation skills but has also organised pop-up citation sessions in January and February.
